



COR Audit Timelines – Frequently Asked Questions

Many employers ask about the length of time it takes to receive their COR. To clarify some of the timeframes for the audit process please review the following frequently asked questions.

Once the auditor has finished onsite activities, is the audit complete?

The COR Audit Standards have specified timeline requirements that need to be followed by auditors. After onsite activities are complete the auditor is given 45 days to write the final report.

As illustrated in the below graphics the COR Audit may go through a series of phases, such as the auditors final report writing, Enform Quality Assurance (QA) Review Process and revisions. These phases are required before the certification can be issued.



What can we do to prevent the COR certifications from expiring before the audit process is complete?

- Know your expiry date and plan enough time based on the illustration above.
- You can negotiate ahead of time specific submission timelines with the auditor prior to the audit starting.

How do I know my audit has been received by Enform?

- Once the Audit Report is submitted to Enform the company contact is notified by email that the audit has been received.
- Allow 4-6 weeks for the QA Review Process.

How do you know your Audit Report has been sent back to the auditor for revisions?

- If the QA process identifies required corrections, the company contact and auditor are notified by email.
- Auditors are then given a 30 day limit (up to 90 days) to address issues raised in the QA Review Process.
